

New Development in San Bernardino Being Completed, See and Visit

STATION crop up on their Avenue very soon! The new station is being built to the rear of the current fire station located at 1920 N Del Rosa , just south of Highland Avenue. According to Battalion Chief Mike McClintock, SB Co Fire, "New Fire Station 226 continues to move ahead in the build process, crews are finishing the framing process and will have a roof on the building in the coming weeks. The fire station is slated for completion in June". The new fire station will be staffed by five personnel, manning a Medic Engine & Medic Squad. Fire station 226 is extremely busy, responding to a total of 9,883 calls (27.07) per day!

Thank You Jian Torkin for your newly Semi Completed "GATEWAY" Project at 5th and "H" St. The Starbucks never seems to have a need for customers. Other new tenants are Del Taco, A 7-Eleven with a Quick Wax Car Wash, Sonic Burger and Ono Hawaiian Barbeque are expected in the future. Some projects were delayed, unfortunately, due to some bad choices made by a few undesirable entrepreneurs.

Thanks to Federal, State, City Leaders and ARPA for a \$35 Million Grant SB Lutheran Social Services Looks Forward to 140 New Housing Units for Men

There will be a lot of construction happening on the property of Lutheran Social Services around "G" and W Virginia Streets in San Bernardino this year. In January Federal, State and City leaders, along with the non-profit sector gathered to show off the SB community Wellness Campus (Lutheran Social Services) and to officially announce the awarding of a \$35 million dollar grant from the CA Department of Housing and Community Development. It is the largest grant awarded during the current round of Home Key funding and is believed to be the largest competitive grant the City of San Bernardino has ever received. Funding for Project Home Key comes from the Federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), which was passed by Congress in 2021, and the State General Fund. The total funds will be used by SB to construct an interim housing facility for up to 140 individuals in partnership with site operator, Lutheran Social Services of So Cal and developer Dignity Moves.

Gov. Newsom praised S.B's Community Wellness Campus, saying it is a creative approach that will serve individuals experiencing chronic homelessness. The work and partnership behind this effort demonstrates what is possible when people think outside the box". Congressman Pete Aguilar was present and said, "It is one of the main goals of ARPA to help ensure that everyone in our community has a Roof over their heads." He added, "I'm proud that nearly \$35 million is coming to the City of San Bernardino to help tackle the housing crisis".

A condition of the funding is that the project must be completed within twelve months. The new modular units will allow residents to stay for up to 180 days as they transition into permanent housing. <u>The housing</u> <u>units hope to be completed in spring of 2025</u>. The facility will also include an on-site federally qualified health clinic; provide case management; behavioral health treatment; job training & placement; rehabilitation services and long term-housing assistance.

San Bernardino is also working to develop a homeless navigation center at the former School of Hope site on 6th St. The facility will provide both housing and services in a central location with as many as 224 housing units in its first phase. The city has allocated \$21 million to build the navigation center, with, \$12.4 million coming from the ARPA funding. In January a Judge issued a temporary injunction against S.B, prohibiting City staff or its contractors from performing encampment cleanups to ensure that individual's property is protected, and accommodations are made for disabled individuals. The court indicated it would consider vacating its order restricting cleanups if the City submits a written policy outlining its homeless encampment clean-up procedures. The City is currently developing such a policy.
