A REVIEW OF THE YEAR

JANUARY Robert Gastel with Arrowhead Mechanical, a family owned business, was installed Chairman of the Board for a second term. Robert continued to see the Chamber through during tough economic times. Local businesses continued to close their doors, either to go elsewhere or just close up shop. Your chamber continually keeps in touch with CalTrans and SanBag playing an advocate role for business during the taxing widening of the I-215 freeway. Time sees to be moving faster than the traffic as we see the improvements appearing on our long awaited beautiful new freeway. Again the **Chamber thanks** everyone, **Caltrans, SanBag, City Engineering Crews and Westbound Communications** for keeping the chamber in the loop and to the businesses involved for their patience. **Good News** for January/February 2011, the northbound on-ramp is expected to open and the southbound 5th Street on and off ramps are also on track to open around April. Always remember, the best is yet to come.



The San Bernardino Salvation Army Opened Its Newest Homeless Shelter “The Hospitality House” In JANUARY, which took several years reaching this destination. Formerly the site of an adult rehabilitation center for men, has been completely renovated and remodeled into an emergency shelter for women and children. The shelter has 21 private rooms, nine bathrooms with handicap access and two laundry rooms for families, a shared living room and dining room, and a kitchen. There are security cameras that cover the entire area and private offices for the staff who are available for counseling.

A grant of \$25,000 allowed The Salvation Army to create a media center and computer lab and library for the

children. A tutoring program has been designed and provided by the SB City Unified School District. In August Target added an additional \$7,500 for the Hospitality House that Captain Stephen Ball, director of the SB Corps of the Salvation Army said will go to replace the doors on the media center/ computer lab, (will have small viewing windows for better safety and supervision and will replace old wooden doors that were left in place during the building renovation) and to renovate the adjacent bathroom and purchase additional books, educational software and educational DVDs for children. The Hospitality House is one of four Salvation Army shelters in SB. The Salvation Army has been in existence since 1865 and in San Bernardino since 1887 supporting those in need. IT WAS A YEAR TO COUNT AND BE COUNTED

As The **Census Officially Kicked Off Its Campaign** also in **JANUARY** the Chamber offered its services by acting as a liaison between business and the Census educating business owners in the value of encouraging their employees to be counted which ultimately meant more dollars for our city.

Omnitrans welcomed a new CEO in JANUARY, Milo Victoria, a veteran with 33 years' experience in the industry, replacing Durand Rall. Victoria was Asst. GM, Bus Service for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority in Washington D.C. overseeing day-to-day operations of Metro's fleet of 1,500 buses, serving more than 360 bus routes, and more than 12,000 bus stops across 1,500 square miles.

FEBRUARY the Chamber was there for the **Hilton Garden Inn** on Waterman Ave for their Grand Opening/Ribbon Cutting. ►



At the **MARCH** Koffee Klatch **Tom Rubio, Director of Public Relations and Marketing**, shown left and **Sam Bashaw, President of SB City Professional Fire Fighters IAFF #891** Charity Committee made a presentation explaining their “**BERDOO BUCKS**” program partnering with the chamber, creating their own “Stimulus Plan”. Each month the chamber selected two member businesses throughout the city, and each month the firemen would pass out \$20 Berdoo Bucks at public gatherings where individuals could redeem them at those designated businesses. During 2010 **San Bernardino City Firefighters IAFF #891** supported SB in many ways, they provided a **\$1,000 scholarship** (which they do yearly) to a SB Area student in each high school (9) based on their dedication to community service for a total of \$9,000. After learning that SBHS Football Coach was purchasing food for his team, Firefighters donated **\$1,000 to assist**. They donated **\$10,000 of holiday food** items from Stater Brothers to Mary's Table for their Holiday Food Bank Donation. Firefighters and the TARGET on Sterling Avenue purchased **\$10,000 worth of school supplies**, clothes and toys for 50 school aged children. Firefighters presented a **check to the Women's Club** to go towards a new roof on their club house on North “E” Street which was badly needed. Since 2005, **Firefighters teach Middle and High School students how Algebra relates to their profession** in an effort to motivate students towards Math, This is done in partnership with the SB City, County Schools and the Alliance for Education Algebra Project. Even though they might not be up on the runway at the annual Headdress Ball, The Firefighters annually **sponsor a Headdress for the Assistance League Event**. Donations of **\$5,000** go to purchase much needed **camping equipment for Boys Scouts of the Lady of Assumption Church** in SB. After learning that a scoreboard at **Blair Park** in SB was inoperable and in disrepair, Firefighters and Quiel Brothers signs purchased a new **\$10,000 scoreboard**. Working with SB Big 5 Sporting Goods, \$2,500 worth of baseball equipment was purchased to replace outdated equipment for the Memorial Creig Nece Field at Wildwood Park.



In closing, each year SB City Firefighters allocate \$60,000 from their own personal monies, deducted from their payroll to a marked labor union account. The Charity Fund purchases desperately needed food, equipment and other vital items for SB based charity, civic and service groups. In addition to the **\$60,000, hundreds of hours are volunteered per each fundraising**, entertainment or support events. Many of the events utilize long-standing relationships with both private and public employee groups within the City and County of San Bernardino. **The Chamber thanks you for your sincere long standing support of our community and for being a member of our chamber.**



Schools continue to be built in San Bernardino. Members of San Manuel Mission Band of Indians and SBCUSD Board Members take part in the ground breaking for the new Indian Springs High School in **MARCH**.

While SB lost Temple Emanu El, it did not lose Clare Cherry School. They moved to 3012 N Waterman Ave, in **MARCH** and the chamber was proud and pleased to have this long standing mainstay remaining in our community with its utmost reputation. Dr. Chas Herbert

(Bright Ideas Book Store) assisted the Chamber with their Ribbon Cutting. In front Councilwoman McCammack, Sheri Maltzman, Past President of Congregation Emanu El and Mayor Morris cut the ribbon.

After having many people enjoy their chamber sponsored trips to China, the Board decided to expand and explore another part of the world sponsoring a trip to **London and Paris** in **APRIL**.

APRIL allowed the chamber to partner with **Kelly Space & Technology** to be part of the grand opening of the new **Technical Employment Training, Inc. School** which was the brain child of former Chairman of the SBACC Board of Directors Mike Gallo. After the closure of Fontana HS machinist training program, Kelly Space, etc. offered to store the equipment. Discussions took place with Dr. Bill Clark the Manufacturing Department Head at SB Valley College regarding the establishment of a Computer Numerically Controlled machine shop at the SB International Airport. One thing led to another which led to the manufacturing trades business and education cooperative in San Bernardino. This ultimately led to the opening of TET, Inc. The school is a cooperative business and education model between Kelly Space & Technology, the SB County Superintendent of Schools' ROP and the County's Workforce Investment Board on the grounds of the SB International Airport, and aims to provide certified employment skills training and job placement assistance to enhance the employability of job seekers, facilitate career growth opportunities for employees and assist employers in acquiring an exceptionally qualified workforce. The 7,000 square foot workshop is filled with the removed equipment from Fontana HS worth \$1.5 million. For information (909) 382-5652 Email: elewis@technicalemploy.org



A New Television Station, VMas, stated the Enterprise zone as an incentive for moving from Murrieta to San Bernardino. The chamber welcomed them and celebrated in a big way at their Grand Opening/Ribbon Cutting held in **MAY** on Cinco De Mayo, with music dancing and wonderful food. VMas can reach audiences from the Mexican border to Santa Barbara and its programming is shown on multiple television stations, which can be used to target English and Spanish speakers.



The Chamber's Annual **Legislative trip to Sacramento** took place in **MAY** allowing our members an opportunity to speak one on one to their elected officials, and also giving us that opportunity to thank them for all their support. **Making the trip this year were: Robert Gastel, Chm of the Chamber Brd; James Penman, SB City Attorney; Wendy McCammack, SB City Councilwoman; Don Averill, Professional Personnel Leasing; Colin Strange, EDA Business Development; Mary Wilson, VP Citizens Business Bank; Matt Florez, Owner McDonalds Restaurant; Carlos Valdez, Judi Penman and Susan Kitchen.** The Governmental Affairs Committee selected the most important issues to address our legislators which included: **Enterprise Zone:** There are those in Sacramento who continue to tinker with, or want to do away with, the enterprise zone, completely delusional that business will stay in CA regardless. Which was why Speaking directly to Senator Denise Ducheny, 40th District, (Portions of San Diego & Riverside Counties all Imperial County), especially important since she was Chm of Budget Committee about how the Enterprise Zone is the only tool California has to compete with neighboring states. Take it away or render it impotent and CA could loose even more jobs to neighboring states. **Your Chamber lobbied to leave the enterprise alone discard SB 974 that will revise eligibility as a qualified employee by eliminating Targeted Employment Areas.**

Education: The chamber was met with Assemblyman Tom Torlakson (at the time candidate for State Superintendent of Public Instruction and won the seat) about education concerns.

Early Inmate Release: *The chamber and the business community it represents has advocated for years to those in charge of State Parolees and the Department of Corrections for help in smoothing out the larger than average parolee release into our city.* As the business climate worsens additional parolees are not something this community can tolerate, nor pay for, with public safety dollars dwindling. Sen Bob Dutton is one of the strongest advocates for small business and spent more than the usual 30 minutes with our delegation.

San Bernardino Observes Memorial Day

It was a day for remembering and a day for being grateful. It was a day once referred to as "Decoration Day". As we sat in our chairs and listened to stories of those who made it possible for us to speak our minds, to read the books we want to, to be able to protect our children, to do so many things we take for granted, we couldn't help but feel emotions of gratitude, patriotism and thankfulness to live in this country.

Glenn Abercombe, Manager of Mt. View Mortuary shown at left with Bob Hines, former owner of Mt. View Cemetery, welcomed veterans, dignitaries and members of the community to the Mt. View Mortuary and Cemetery's annual Memorial Day Observance. The following was his opening presentation:

It has been twelve months since we were together at this same spot to pay honor to those that have served our country and those who gave the ultimate sacrifice. My friends in the previous year many things have happened that have reshaped the history of our Nation. However I would like to share three personal and more local events that have notable significance and relate to the meaning of Memorial day.

1. Each year countless Veterans, due to their circumstances die homeless. Dignity Memorial established the Homeless Veterans Program and since the year 2000 have provided over 600 funerals to homeless Vets. On November 10, 2009 I was proud to represent Mt View and Dignity memorial in laying to rest 11 homeless veterans at Riverside National Cemetery with full Military Honors at no cost to the VA. Since this date we have worked with local authorities to arrange over 5 additional homeless veterans services.
2. On the following day, Veterans Day, November 11, 2008 Stater Bros. Markets, their Chairman Jack H. Brown and Mt. View honored a local hero, Colonel Chuck Rodriquez, recipient of the congressional Medal of Honor for action taken against the enemy in Korea. A memorial fitting of a hero was laid near his grave in Memory gardens at Mt. View.
3. In March, Dignity Memorial was honored to provide transportation for several Medal of Honor recipients that participated in the Heroes Challenge event sponsored by Stater Bros Charities. Meeting these brave men will always be one of those humbling moments in life.

In **JUNE** the chamber began a series of workshops presented by the Chamber Board of Directors compiled from their expertise and background of their individual talent. The first workshop was titled "**ANALYZING THE LINEUP**" presented by **Gary Ellis Management Consultants, LLC** and C.O.O. Managed Pharmacy Care Inc. Two, one and one half hour workshops were presented with valuable information disseminated on various avenues of marketing techniques.
